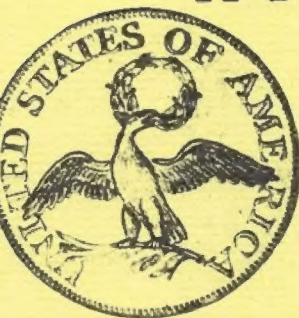

# GREATER PITTSBURGH INTERNATIONAL COIN EXPO

## MAY 28, 29 & 30, 1976



You are cordially invited to attend and participate in the GREATER PITTSBURGH INTERNATIONAL COIN EXPOSITION. This event will be held at the Greater Pittsburgh Merchandise Mart on May 28, 29, and 30, 1976. This facility is located adjacent to the Monroeville Mall and the Sheraton Inn-on-the-Mall in Monroeville, Pennsylvania. Mr. Virgil Hancock's counterfeit seminar, and an auction by Joseph Lepczyk will be conducted in conjunction with this convention.

Dealers Bourse

There is adequate space for at least 100 numismatic dealers. The sponsor will attempt to have dealers of United States coins and numismatic material present as well as a number of dealers in foreign numismatic material. Show hours are from 10 A.M. May 28th to 5 P.M. May 30th, 1976. Closing hour on the 28th and 29th will be 8:00 P.M. The bourse table charge will be \$150.00 for a ten foot booth, with sufficient tables for display and backup. Overhead lighting should be adequate for your display needs. You will be provided with a sign for dealer identification. Coin display cases will be available for a rental of \$5.00 per case additional, and you must arrange for these in advance with the Exposition Chairman.

Security

Every attempt will be made to provide adequate security from 5 P.M. May 27th, through the conclusion of the show at 5 P.M. May 30th.

Motel Accommodations

Please read and use the attached SHERATON INN-ON-THE-MALL reservation card for your coin expo lodging. All other inquiries should be directed to Mr. Clifford Sutton, The Collector's Cabinet, 258 Monroeville Mall, Monroeville, PA. 15146. No bourse application will be accepted unless it is accompanied by a deposit check of at least \$75.00. The balance to be paid two weeks prior to the Exposition.

I plan to attend the GREATER PITTSBURGH INTERNATIONAL COIN EXPO to be held on May 28, 29, and 30, 1976, and I agree to abide by the following: Bourse tables are available only to dealers selling, trading, or displaying coins and numismatic material. Space allotted to an applicant is not to be sub-let or shared with another party without the prior consent of the Exposition Chairman. Police protection will be provided throughout the entire show, however, the Western Pennsylvania Numismatic Society, the Collector's Cabinet, Inc., and the owners of the Greater Pittsburgh Merchandise Mart, will not be held responsible for the loss of dealers coins or supplies or personal injuries.
